From the Desk of the Tumuaki

Welcome to the 2025 school year. We hope you have had a superb summer break, enjoyed celebrating Christmas, and had a great time with your family. We have a full team of excellent staff, a near full starting roll and a lot of great things planned for this year. We are looking forward to rolling these out and watching our kids grow.

We have a large number of new students starting with us today. We welcome the following students and their families; Tom Smith, Ryder Ugalde, Noah van der Wel, Luan Ray-Londt and Lyam Hampton in the Junior class, Daniella Cornwall in our Year 2/3 class, Sharl van der Mark, Talon Coombe and Elly Hampton in our Year 4/5 class, Amy Hampton and Hein van der Mark in our Year 5/6 class, and Laura Sinclair and Linay van der Mark in our Year 7/8 class. Mrs Marx shares this class with Mrs Fawcett who still works in here for two days per week. Mrs Marx will also do one day per week in the Junior class covering teacher release time in this space. years and we are thrilled to have her join our team this year.

WHAT'S NEW AT MCS?

During the holidays a few key projects happened preparing the school for the new year:

Roof extensions: Across Rooms 1 and 2 (Years 4—6) new sunshade rooves are being fitted and are due for completion over the next day. Like on the Junior room, these rooves are being fitted to make the decks an extension of the learning areas of these two classrooms providing sun and weather protection. Later this term external ranch sliders will be fitted to these classrooms to allow



them to become an extension of the classroom space.

New carpet: Room 4 (Years 2—3) has had new carpet and lino fitted making this classroom feel like a nice classroom now. In the next holidays we are expecting to also carpet the Senior class and the administration block which should really lift the feel of our spaces.

Our grateful thanks go to our two boards who funded these projects in our continued effort to lift the image and feel of the school.



SWIMMING

School swimming starts next week on Wednesday the 5th of February. All students will be bused to the Matamata Pools every Wednesday and Friday mid



morning for five weeks and a total of eight lessons.

Swimming is a really important component of our PE programme as it doesn't just develop physical skills but develops safety in the water including knowledge of what to do if you get in trouble. With New Zealand being surrounded by ocean and blessed with beautiful lakes and rivers, swimming is a crucial skill to master. We consider it one of the most important components of our PE programme because of the safety and survival skills developed. Please help your child to come with their swimming gear each Wednesday and Friday and encourage them to be fully

involved. Notes need to please be sent if your child is unable to swim.

The cost of swimming and the bus trips are being covered by the school for all students as part of the government's sponsorship programme.



FAMILY PICNIC AND O'NIGHT

Universities have O'Week, we have O'Night. O'Night is for our parents to understand what is happening in your children's classes and to get the run down on how things work. We kick off with a family picnic where



we can all meet different members of the community and welcome in new families.

YEAR 7 IMMUNISATIONS

These forms need to please be completed and sent back to school as soon as possible. All forms need to be returned whether you choose to give consent or want to turn down the immunisations.

HPV IMMUNISATIONS

All Year 7 and 8 students are also eligible to recieve for free the HPV immunisations. Please note that



this is not offered in our school and you will need to get this through your local GP if you want them to have this.



SPORTS ACADEMY IS BACK FOR 2025!

In 2023 we started our new Sports Academy which has been a big hit with our students and families. Now it's returning for 2025.

Aimed at students Year 3 and up, the MCS Sports Academy is run after school each Thursday afternoon, 3:15—4:30PM, by a faithful group of parents, and will start in our fourth week back on Thursday the 20th of February. Students are taught general ball and fine motor skills, specific sports skills and will develop their fitness.

The vision of Sports Academy is to have our students better prepared for playing sports and to develop in them a healthy passion for moving, staying fit, enjoying developing physical skills and competing. We want them to be better prepared, fitter and more skilled when we hit the first games of the season.



TERM 1 TOPICS

Every year we review and develop our teaching curriculum to meet the needs of our students. This year the government has also made changes to some curriculum



areas, notably in English and Mathematics. This will result in some changes to the way we teach and report in these areas. We have always been very proud of the curriculum we develop and the topics we teach in 2025 will be no different. Each year our needs change and areas of student's competencies and social needs adjust too. We believe over the years we have developed an excellent curriculum that responds to this.

In the first term of each year we always have our Kid on the Rock unit. This is a two year programme which this year looks at our heritage and delves into Aotearoa New Zealand History. It will also look briefly into who your child is and how they fit into the world around them and will deal with digital citizenship and safety. As part of our history studies class trips are being organised to help reinforce the learning. Of



course, for the Senior class, this will culminate in the famous Northland history

trip where they will walk in the footsteps of some of those who originally



shaped our nation.

Our whole curriculum is designed to be impacting. At our heart we are partnering with you to help develop your children academically, spiritually, physically and to be emotionally well balanced. Please accept this invitation to partner with us in this journey so together we can have the biggest influence and impact on your children.

Other than Reading, Writing and Mathematics our topics can be found on the chart on this page.

Please note that if you have a child in the Senior class the way we do Tech Arts has now changed. Instead of walking over to the Intermediate twice a week for $1^{-1}/_2$ sessions we are now doing a three day block across the term, one full day per week for three weeks, as an intensive programme. This will still take place at the Intermediate. Students will do Food Tech this term, Hard Materials next term and Soft Materials in Term 3. All other components such as the Arts will be run back here at school throughout the year.

Each year I like to remind parents of the following point. One of the biggest ways you can help your child with their academic learning and their ability to learn how to socialise, work with and get on with others, is to make time to talk to them every day. Ask them about their learning, about their friends, and their understanding of God. Recognise that because they are growing and learning to understand their world they will not always interpret things correctly. That's why they need to talk to you so much. A statistic I remind people of explains that 80% of the feedback a child gets is from their peers, and of that feedback 80% of it is always wrong! This isn't just about their work but about their understanding of life and friendships too. Please take the time to listen to and input into their lives.

Can we ask one more thing of you too? From time to time children will share something that doesn't always make sense or sounds concerning. If this happens please take the time to discuss it with your child's teacher. Children do not always have the right end of the stick and this can usually be quickly sorted with a swift polite visit which puts everyone back on the right track.

Sometimes there are things that happen that teachers don't know about but could do with knowing. This can be very beneficial for helping staff deal with different matters and it helps diffuse situations before they ever become big ones. The same can be said if you have a complaint. We do want to know and sort potential problems.

We have a a superb staff and we are full of expectation for what this year will bring.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

A big thank you to all those who came in and sorted their school uniform last week, and for everyone having their stationery ready for today.

Please can you make sure that each item of your children's uniform is named. This makes it very easy to return if it is found roaming around looking for its owner!

Please remember black sandals are our footwear in summer but we recommend you check the quality of these before buying them. Sandals need to be plain black. While there are a range of acceptable ones please note they cannot be fashion items or notably label branded. We are only accepting other types of footwear where this is accompanied by a doctors note explaining why an alternative is needed. Every student must also wear a school hat in Terms 1 and 4 for sun safe protection. These can be bought at school and are designed to be practical and give excellent protection.







Note correct school uniform is part of each child's Rockstar awards each term. We are tightening up on these points this term as we want our students to wear their uniform with pride.

PLEASE WATCH YOUR SPEED

Please note that during peak school hours at the start and end of each school day the speed limit around schools drops to 40km/h. In the first few weeks of term the Police are particularly vigilant
