From the Desk of the Tumuaki

A very warm welcome back for Term 3 to everyone. Term 3 is always one of our best in terms of having far fewer interruptions to the normal programming that other terms have, and it is therefore one of our best opportunities to make academic progress for all of our students. We are looking forward to making the most of this and ask you to pray for student progress and good health for everyone through this term.

We have lots of opportunities and some pretty cool experiences for our students which you can read about through this newsletter and particularly on page 7. We have made some changes to our topics this term from what was originally intended and proposed, but we believe these will open up even deeper learning and opportunities for everyone in their learning.

We have new students to welcome in this term too. We welcome Elizabeth Moore as a new entrant, Isabel Rees who joins us in Year 6, and Zanru Hamann at Year 7. Elizabeth is the younger sister of Rebekah, Sophie, Jessica and Isaac, Isabel comes from England with her mother joining the YWAM staff, and Zanru is the older brother of Zinaske who started with us back in Term 1. We welcome each to the school and the Rees family to our school family.

Growing into the Future

As we start the new term many have been asking me how we are going with our application to extend the school roll and about our other application to include Year 9 and 10 students in the future.

As most know our current roll cap is for 120 students and this includes a non-preference roll of just nine students. We are very close to this at present. At the end of last term we put in an application to immediately grow our roll to 150 over two years (to 135 in 2025 and then 150 after that). This would include extending our non-preference roll to 15 students. This application is in with the Ministry of Education.

At the same time we lodged this application we also lodged an application to integrate Years 9 and 10 into the school too. At this stage, if accepted, that would likely begin in 2027 with Year 9 and include Year 10 the following year. With this we have also asked to further grow the school to 180 students too.

While the applications are in with the Ministry of Education now they have indicated that they lack details about our school property that we had thought was on record. This means we are currently having to have detailed plans of our existing buildings and property drawn up to submit to the Ministry. From there, as part of their assessment, the Ministry reviews what classrooms, withdrawal rooms, office and administration spaces and bathrooms we require to extend our numbers. As you know we are expecting to build two classrooms anyway and we have begun planning for this.

Building capacity is of course not the only consideration for the Ministry. Our recent and trending ERO reviews are considered along with the impact our growth may have on other local schools together with their capacity for growth. We have carried out some initial consultation with other Matamata schools and the Ministry will carry out some too.

Some of the feedback from those schools about what we are doing and propose to do has been very pleasing and even

These applications are only the start too. If approved there is a lot we need to prepare for and get greater understandings around. But we've done it all before. That is of course how we have got to this point.

TERM 3 TOPICS

Every year we review and develop our teaching curriculum to meet the needs of our students. We have always been very proud of the curriculum we develop and the topics we teach. 2024 is no different. Each year our needs change along with student's

competencies and social needs. We believe over the years we have been developing an excellent curriculum that responds to this.

Important to us in the development of our students is not only academic achievement but developing resilience, empathy for others, and becoming well rounded citizens that can think for themselves, problem solve, participate physically, develop skills and an appreciation for the arts, develop a heart after God's own heart and therefore be active in their church life, and engage in society responsibly with a Christian worldview.

This term is again a busy one and in topic we are integrating our learning within the topics of Science, Social Science and Technology to learn about Science in Sport. With the Paris Olympics on in the first part of the term it creates a segway for us to explore this. Running alongside this will be the return of our bi-annual Olympirua that we run whenever the Olympic or Commonwealth Games are on. This is a series of track and field events and our annual cross country which are all done for our famous gold, silver and bronze cardboard medals. Students compete at class levels for these.

Term 3 is also the term where we do our annual speeches. For Year 5—8 students they are also preparing for the chance to compete at the annual Bethlehem Chapman Speech Competition in Rotorua which is held in early Term 4. Only two from each of the senior classes can be selected to represent our school there. This event also holds a Chess Championship so students from the senior classes will have trials throughout Term 3 to earn selection for this too.

Term 3 also is Sports Camp term for our Year 7 and 8 students. Each year we form a combined team with the Year 7 and 8 students from Hamilton SDA creating a team of 36 that will compete for a week against seven other teams of schools from around the central North Island. At Sports Camp our students compete across 40 different sports codes in some very intense match ups. Trials for Sports Camp happen on Thursday and Friday next week (August 1-2) when students from Hamilton SDA will join us for a training and selection overnighter here at MCS. Only 21 can be selected from our students and 15 from Hamilton SDA for the team.



COMPLAINTS PROCEDURES

COMMUNITY NOTE

Matamata Christian School values feedback and believes this is an important way for it to improve its performance. It believes complaints are a part of this and wishes to be able to resolve these in order to avoid anything standing in the way of it achieving its goals. Therefore anyone who may have a complaint about any part of the school life is encouraged to bring those complaints forward in a biblical manner. This means:

To resolve conflict -

"If your brother sins against you, go to him and show him his fault. But do it privately, just between yourselves. If he listens to you, you have won your brother back. But if he will not listen to you, take one or two other persons with you, so that 'every accusation may be upheld by the testimony of two or more witnesses', as the scripture says."

- Matthew 18:15-16

In response to complaints -

"Remember this, my dear friends! Everyone must be quick to listen, but slow to speak and slow to become angry."

— James 1:19

"Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you."

— Ephesians 4:32

Please remember that complaints can be embarrassing for people. It is important to respect a person's integrity by approaching them in confidence first to resolve this rather than sharing this with others. If a complaint is about wrongdoing between students at school please do not try to resolve this directly between other parents but get the classroom teacher to resolve this between families.

If a complaint is about a School Board issue or matter please use their complaints procedures chart (available from school).
